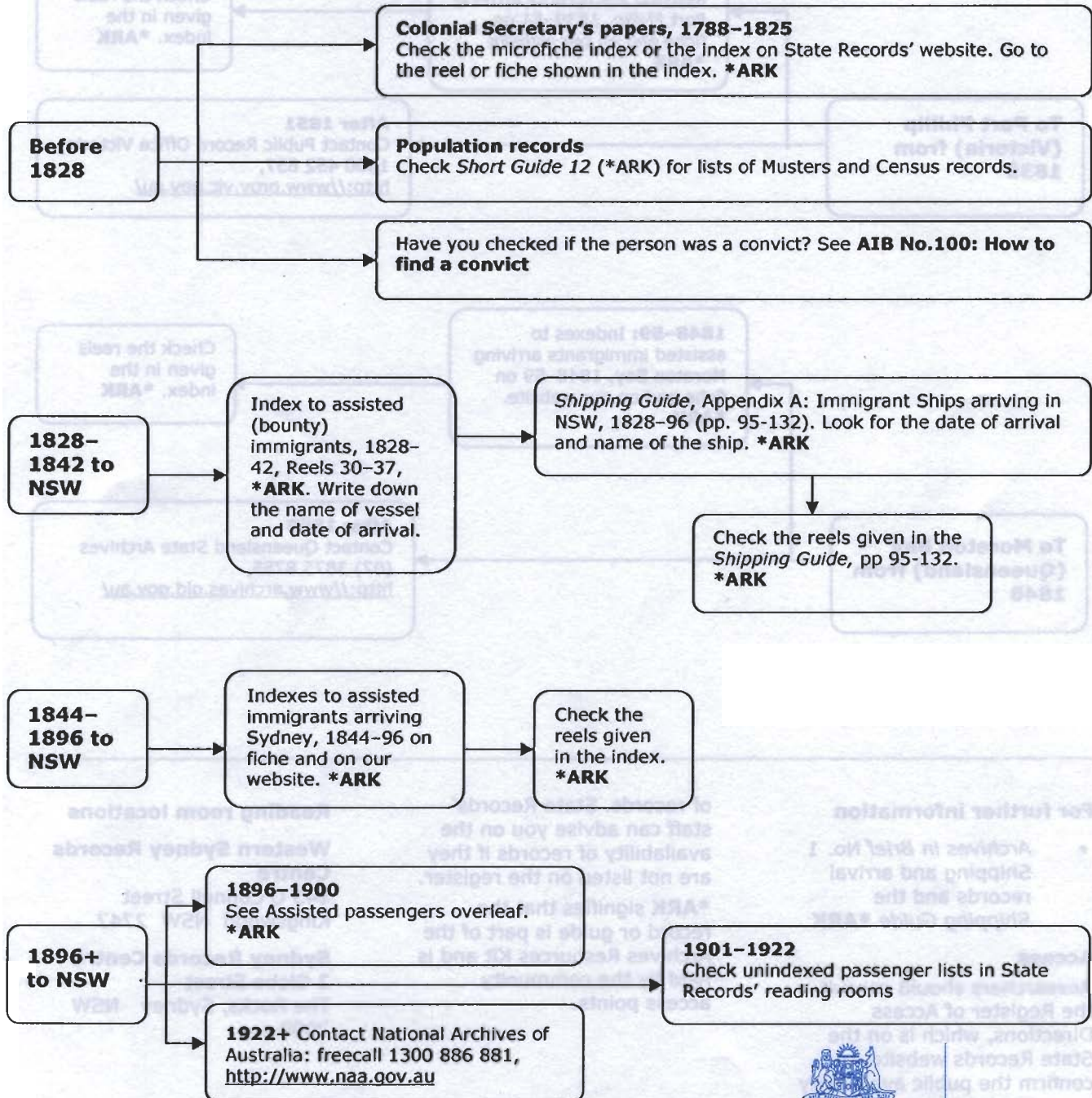


## How to find assisted immigrants

This *Archives in Brief* (AIB) provides step by step instructions on how to find records relating to assisted immigrants.

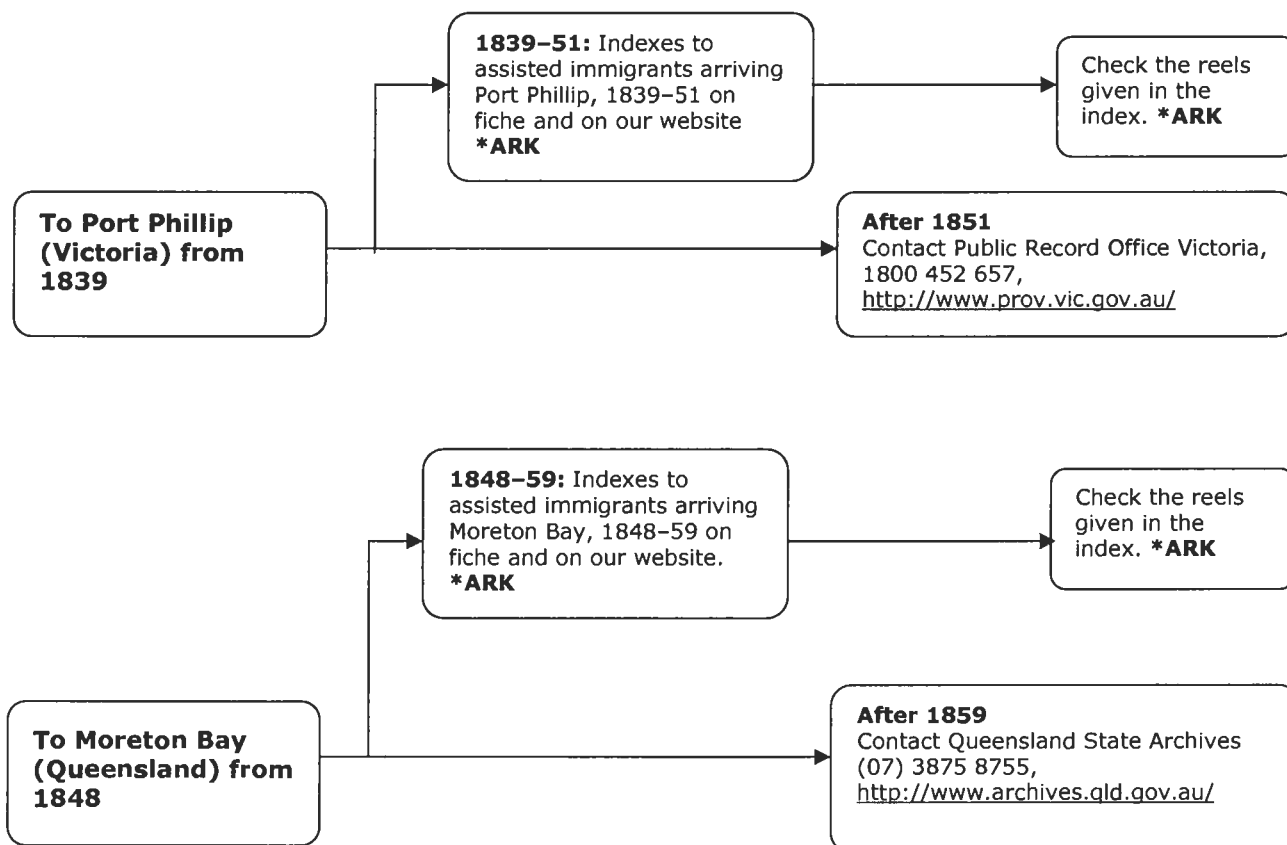


### Assisted immigration to Victoria and Queensland

In the early part of the nineteenth century both Queensland and Victoria were parts of New South Wales.

Victoria separated from NSW in 1851 and Queensland separated in 1859. State Records NSW holds records of assisted immigrants arriving in Port Phillip (Victoria) between 1839 and 1851; and

arriving in Moreton Bay (Queensland) between 1848 and 1859.
