Agreeably to that Part of His Excellency
the Governor's Proclamation, bearing Date the
first Day of November last, wherein His Excellency
invited a general friendly Meeting of the
Natives, they are now reminded of the
same; and Notice is hereby given, that the
said friendly Meeting of the Black Natives
or Aborigines of this Colony, will be held
at the Market Place in Parramatta, on
Saturday next, the 28th of this present
Month of December, at the Hour of Ten in
the Forenoon. And the Natives are accordingly
invited and requested to attend on that

Occassion with their Families, under the Assurance of being Kindly received, and plentifully furnished with Refreshments of Meat and Drink.

The Magistrates, Peace Officers, and Settlers throughout the Colony, will be pleased to acquaint the Natives residing in their respective Neighbourhoods, or occassionally resorting thither, with the present Invitation for a general Meeting on the said 28th Day of December Instant.

And the Gentlemen composing the Committee of the Native Institution, are requested to assemble at Government House, Parramatta, a little before the Hour of Ten in the Morning, on the said 28th instant.
